This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

**You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.**

## What is this product?

**Type** The product is in the form of a certificate issued under English law. It is an interest bearing security, but your interest is not guaranteed. The payment obligations of the product manufacturer are not guaranteed by any entity.

**Term** The product has a fixed term and will be due on November 18, 2025.

**Objectives** The product pays interest that is linked to the performance of the underlying assets (as defined below). What you will receive at the end of the term of the product is not certain and will depend on the performance of the ordinary shares of Chevron Corporation (ISIN: US1667641005) and Engie (ISIN: FR0010208488), listed on New York Stock Exchange and Euronext Paris S.A., respectively (the **underlying assets**). The product has a fixed term, ending on November 18, 2025. Each certificate has a face value of USD 1,000. The issue price is 100.00% of the face value. The product is not listed on an exchange. The subscription period is from April 22, 2024 to May 10, 2024. The issue date is May 17, 2024.

**Interest:** If the closing price of each underlying asset on November 10, 2025 is at or above its interest barrier, you will receive interest of USD 137.25 on November 18, 2025 for each certificate that you hold.

### Repayment at maturity:

On November 18, 2025, you will receive USD 1,000.00 for each certificate that you hold.

The initial reference prices and interest barriers are shown below.

The initial reference price of an underlying asset is the closing price of such underlying asset on May 10, 2024.

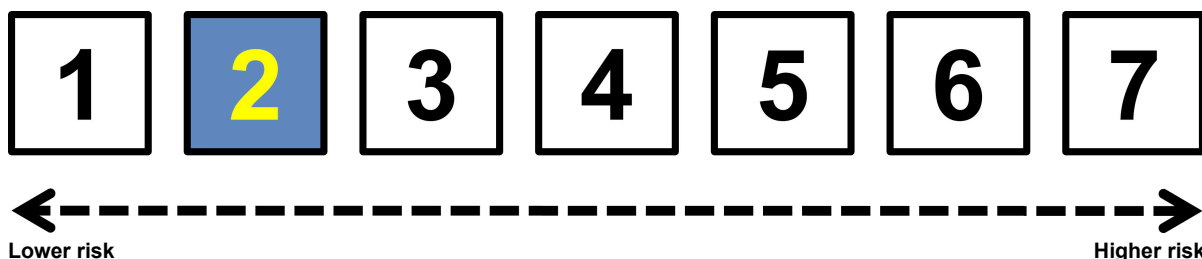
The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the underlying assets, the product and the product manufacturer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

**Intended retail investor** The product is intended to be offered to retail investors who:

1. have the ability to make an informed investment decision through sufficient knowledge and understanding of the product and its specific risks and rewards, with experience of investing in and/or holding a number of similar products providing a similar market exposure;
2. seek income, expect the movement in the underlying assets to perform in a way that generates a favourable return and have an investment horizon of the recommended holding period specified below;
3. accept the risk that the issuer could fail to pay or perform its obligations under the product but otherwise are not able to bear any loss of their investment;
4. are willing to accept a level of risk to achieve potential returns that is consistent with the summary risk indicator shown below; and
5. are making use of professional advice.

## What are the risks and what could I get in return?

## Risk indicator



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product until November 18, 2025. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to cash in early. You may have to pay significant extra costs to cash in early.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class. This takes into account two elements: (1) the market risk - that the potential losses for future performance are rated at a low level; and (2) the credit risk - that poor market conditions are deemed very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

**Be aware of currency risk. You will receive payments in a different currency so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.**

You are entitled to receive back at least 100.00% of the face value of the product. Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on future market performance and is uncertain. However, this protection against future market performance will not apply if you cash in before November 18, 2025. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

The favourable, moderate, unfavourable and stress scenarios represent possible outcomes that have been calculated based on simulations using the reference assets' past performance over a period of up to 5 years. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances. This product cannot be easily cashed in. If you exit the investment earlier than the recommended holding period you do not have a guarantee and you may have to pay extra costs.

## What happens if Goldman Sachs International is unable to pay out?

## Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest and how long you hold the product. - In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.

#### How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

##### **Recommended holding period: 1 year and 6 months**

The recommended holding period for the product is 1 year and 6 months as the product is designed to be held until maturity; however the product may terminate early due to an extraordinary event. You have no contractual right to terminate the product prior to maturity.

The manufacturer is under no obligation to make a secondary market in the product, but may repurchase the product prior to maturity on a case-by-case basis. In such circumstances, the price quoted will reflect a bid-ask spread and any costs associated with unwinding the hedging arrangements of the manufacturer in connection with the product. In addition, the person who sold you the product may charge you brokerage fees when you sell the product.
