You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

Туре	The product is in the form of a certificate issued under English law. It is not an interest bearing security. The payment obligations of the product manufacturer are not guaranteed by any entity.
Term	The product has a fixed term and will be due on June 8, 2028, subject to an early redemption.
Objectives	The product provides the potential for capital growth and does not pay interest. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?
