

Purpose

This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

Type The product is in the form of a certificate issued under English law. It is not an interest bearing security. The payment obligations of the product manufacturer are not guaranteed by any entity.

Objectives The product provides the potential for capital growth and does not pay interest. What you will receive at the end of the term of the product is not certain and will depend on the performance of the ordinary shares of Enel S.p.A. (ISIN: IT0003128367), E.ON SE (ISIN: DE000ENAG999) and Fortum OYJ (ISIN: FI0009007132), listed on Borsa Italiana, XETRA and Nasdaq Helsinki, respectively (the **underlying assets**). The term of the product will end no later than March 3, 2027. However, the product may terminate early depending on the performance of the underlying assets. Each certificate has a face value of EUR 1,000. The issue price is 100.00% of the face value. The product is not listed on an exchange. The subscription period is from February 6, 2023 to February 24, 2023. The issue date is March 3, 2023.

Autocall feature: If the closing price of each underlying asset on any autocall observation date is at or above its autocall barrier, the product will terminate on the corresponding autocall payment date. In this case, you will receive an autocall payment for each certificate that you hold. Autocall observation dates are each trading day rolling annually from February 24, 2024 (inclusive) to February 24, 2026 (inclusive). Autocall payment dates are dates falling 5 business days after each autocall observation date. Autocall payment for the first autocall payment date is EUR 1,070.00 and will subsequently increase by EUR 70.00 with each autocall payment date.

Repayment at maturity:

This section applies only if no autocall occurs as described above.

On March 3, 2027, for each certificate that you hold:

1. If the closing price of the underlying asset with the lowest performance (as compared with its initial reference price) on February 24, 2027 is at least equal to its initial reference price, you will receive EUR 1,280.00; or
2. *Otherwise*, you will receive EUR 1,000.00;

The initial reference prices and autocall barriers are shown below.

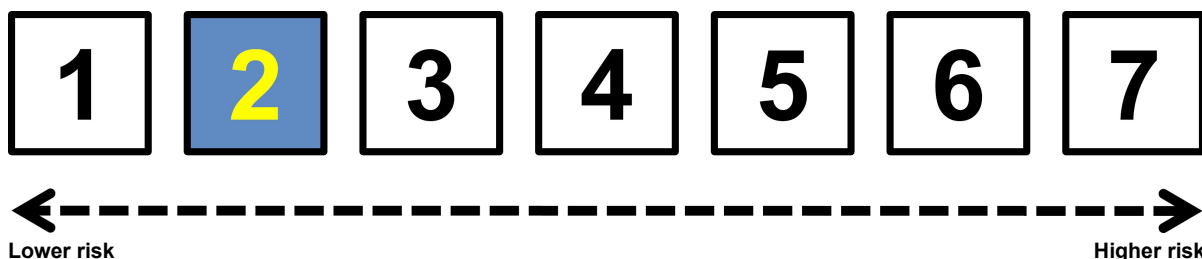
The initial reference price of an underlying asset is the closing price of such underlying asset on February 24, 2023.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the underlying assets, the product and the product manufacturer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

Intended retail investor The product is intended to be offered to retail investors who:

1. have the ability to make an informed investment decision through sufficient knowledge and understanding of the product and its specific risks and rewards, with experience of investing in and/or holding a number of similar products providing a similar market exposure;
2. seek capital growth, expect the movement in the underlying assets to perform in a way that generates a favourable return, have an investment horizon of the recommended holding period specified below and understand that the product may terminate early;
3. accept the risk that the issuer could fail to pay or perform its obligations under the product but otherwise are not able to bear any loss of their investment;
4. are willing to accept a level of risk to achieve potential returns that is consistent with the summary risk indicator shown below; and
5. are making use of professional advice.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 4 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to cash in early. You may have to pay significant extra costs to cash in early.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class. This takes into account two elements: (1) the market risk - that the potential losses for future performance are rated at a low level; and (2) the credit risk - that poor market conditions are deemed very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk. You will receive payments in a different currency so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

You are entitled to receive back at least 100.00% of the face value of the product. Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on future market performance and is uncertain. However, this protection against future market performance will not apply if you cash in before March 3, 2027. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

Inflation erodes the purchasing value of cash over time and this may result in the decline in real terms of any capital reimbursed.

Investment performance information

Main factors likely to affect future returns on the product

Your return on the product at the end of the recommended holding period will principally be affected by (1) the price at which you purchase the product, (2) the performance of the underlying assets over the recommended holding period and (3) the ability of the issuer to make payments that become due on the product. The value of the product before the maturity date or early termination of the product will also be affected by general economic and market conditions, the volatility of the underlying assets (which is a measure of the extent of movement in the prices of the underlying assets), interest rates, the dividend yield of the underlying assets, the correlation between the various underlying assets, the remaining time to maturity and the ability of the issuer to make payments.

What could affect my return positively?

- An increase in the prices of the underlying assets

What could affect my return negatively?

- The issuer's inability to make payments on the product when they fall due

The factors listed above provide general guidance on how changes in the prices of the underlying assets may affect your return if you purchase the product at inception and hold it to the end of the recommended holding period. If you purchase or sell the product after inception, your return on the product will also be affected by the purchase or sale price and the prices of the underlying assets at the time of sale or, in the case of a purchase, at and following the time of purchase. The precise impact will depend on the timing and effects of these changes, and the above list should not be viewed as guaranteeing a particular outcome. See "1. In severely adverse market conditions, if you hold the product to the end of the recommended holding period, you are entitled to receive back 100.00% of your investment. Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on market conditions and is uncertain.

If you sell the product in severely adverse market conditions prior to the recommended holding period, your return may be lower than what you would have received if you held the product to the end of the recommended holding period and may be as low as zero. What happens if Goldman Sachs International is unable to pay out?

The product is not covered by an investor protection or guarantee scheme. This means that if we become insolvent you may suffer a total loss of your investment.

What are the costs?

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs.

The amounts shown here are the cumulative costs of the product itself, for three different holding periods. They include potential early exit penalties. The figures assume you invest EUR 10,000.00. The figures are estimates and may change in the future.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 4 years

The recommended holding period for the product is 4 years as the product is designed to be held until maturity; however the product may terminate early due to an autocall or an extraordinary event. You have no contractual right to terminate the product prior to maturity.

The manufacturer is under no obligation to make a secondary market in the product, but may repurchase the product prior to maturity on a case-by-case basis. In such circumstances, the price quoted will reflect a bid-ask spread and any costs associated with unwinding the hedging arrangements of the manufacturer in connection with the product. In addition, the person who sold you the product may charge you brokerage fees when you sell the product.

How can I complain?
